STORIES FROM OUR CLIENTS

'When I first came to the TRC things felt difficult.

My daddy had died when I was two and a half and I missed him. I would sometimes get very angry, especially at bedtimes. I would also find it difficult to leave mummy for school and things like that. Plus I had nightmares quite often.

In therapy we did lots of things to explore feelings. Through these things I was able to understand more about my angry and sad feelings, and learn what I can do when they get too big for me.

Things have changed now, I feel happier. I am less angry and usually feel okay about leaving mummy. Also, I do not have the bad dreams nowadays very often.

I do have tactics for when my feelings get too big for me to manage. Also I know if I am worried about anything I can come and talk to mummy.'

"I came to TRC because I had very bad people who were mean and horrible and smelly and I wasn't safe. I went to stay with other people and ended up with mummy and daddy who are kind and nice. When I first came to TRC I was really scared and I wasn't sure if I was safe. I had really bad night terrors, big angry feelings and I cried for four times a day. It was scary with friends.

In sessions at TRC we played babies and made stuff. I had stories and made pictures and paintings. Now I have less night terrors and I'm good at saying how I really feel. I know how to calm down now because I found out how my brain works.

Things now are mostly good but I still hate saying anything about what happened so I don't talk about it. I still have angry feelings but I can calm down quicker. I have a fiddle box and I am amazing. I can do brilliant strong sitting and butterfly hugs. I let my feelings out more safely – I am incredible."

A WORD FROM BETSY, TRC FOUNDER AND DIRECTOR



I have been busy developing the TRC's infrastructure in preparation for the expansion which is so needed. We are often overwhelmed by the emails and desperation that we receive to have such a service in other parts of the UK.

I am also involved in working with other leading trauma/emotional wellbeing trainers in the UK in working towards a module for the initial teacher training courses- including writing a book for this of which I am writing one chapter. This chapter will be exploring the trauma continuum with special attention on children and young people facing complex trauma.

I am able to spread the word about the TRC in a number of other settings where I am asked to deliver training all over the country including professionals from Oxfordshire, Derbyshire, Northern Ireland, London, Bristol, North Somerset, Cornwall, Bradford, Warwickshire, Kent, Gloucestershire, Wiltshire and many other places! I have trained whole school clusters, therapy centre staff, virtual school staff, educational psychologists, education staff, behaviour support staff and social workers and many others.

I am also a stakeholder for several NICE projects (The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) such as children attachment, PTSD and others. I am actively involved in the charity Institute for the Recovery of Childhood Trauma which has influence in policy and practice across the UK.

I have another book being published by Jessica Kingsley in September called The Simple Guide to Understanding Trauma. Emma Reeves, the lead therapist at Bath TRC did the illustrations for the book which aims to help those who don't want to read a long book, understand trauma and what to do to help others.

A WORD FROM CLAIRE, OPERATIONS MANAGER

This year has been hugely rewarding as our multidisciplinary team continued to expand and we helped more children, young people and their families recover from trauma. Research has highlighted the significant long term effects that trauma can have if there is no intervention, therefore it is a huge privilege to be able to provide an excellent, tailored recovery programme for as long as is needed.



Through client assessments we can see the positive results of the therapy, whereby trauma symptoms reduce significantly and we receive many reports that children are transformed into happy kids that are no longer plagued with worries.



The expansion of the TRC out of the South West of England is an exciting prospect which is in process following an introduction meeting in Guernsey in May 2016; centres here and in Bradford will open later this year, allowing more children and families to be helped in their recovery from trauma.

TRC ACHIEVEMENTS 2015-16

- Started Friday afternoon assessment sessions for potential Oakside referrals
- 3 Oakside primary students graduated and 8 were seen over the course of the academic year
- Our staff were part of 100s of TAFs, CINs, CP and other meetings and wrote many court reports
- Completed many clinical assessments to track progress and focus treatment plans to see effective recovery
- TRC attended 4 quarterly Human Trafficking Foundation forums along with many other NGO's, research groups and other parties committed to the anti-human trafficking cause
- We employed new staff, including a social worker, 3 therapeutic workers, a family therapist, a graphic designer and a translator
- We provided placements for 3 trainee therapists/counsellors,
 4 trainee therapeutic mentors & work experience for college students









- We wrote many grant applications and held fundraising campaigns
- We received £1000 Starbucks Red Cup Cheer Campaign
- We were charity of the year for Bath Building Society who did a fantastic job of fundraising for TRC throughout the year
- We were kindly awarded a donation from Bath Rotary who organise Bath's annual firework display, with their proceeds coming to Bath building society's chosen charity
- We were also charity of the year for Bath Rugby, shaking buckets at 4 of their matches
- The director delivered several presentations on Trauma Recovery in the House of Lords
- The TRC training centre hosted over 30 training events
- Our director trained schools from many local authorities, equipping 1891 education professionals, at 24 training events, and 420 police, foster care and therapy professionals, at 14 training events, with skills in working with traumatised children
- Our average facebook audience is 2,500 per week with 763 likes on the page and 707 twitter followers
- Our turnover was £223,584 in 2015-16
- Grants were awarded to help with the charity's core costs over the next 3 years


